Harrow Club V Phoenix Rovers
Harrow Club v The Wanderers

Hayes United v Harefield Ex

Due to the circumstances game to be rescheduled, Hayes United to be instructed to ensure opponents are told the ground they use is artificial.

London United v AGBLC

Due to the referees report the game to be rescheduled.

New Life Assembly v Samba Street Soccer

Due to circumstances game to be rescheduled, possible promotion place in question
New Life warned to future conduct

Samba Street Soccer v Renegades

Due to circumstances game to be rescheduled, possible promotion place in question
Renegades warned to future conduct

Stonewall Reserves v Harefield Wenesday Reserves

Game to be rescheduled under FA rules

Southall V Walthamstowe Avenue & Pennant

Game to be awarded to away team as Southall failed to provide a ground for this match.
Southal fined under rule 10(F) (i)

Harrow Club Reserves V Stonewall Reserves

Due to circumstances game to be rescheduled, pitch having been 'called' of by local council.

Renegades v Acton Town

Game to be awarded to away team as no answer received by the Discipline Secretary regarding the allegations of fielding an ineligible player from Renegades.
Renegades to be fined under rule 8(Q) (i)

Hounslow Wanderers Reserves v Cockfosters A

Due to circumstances game to be rescheduled
Cockfosters warned to future conduct

Clubs to be penalised under rule 18

‘do hereby on behalf of the Club jointly and severally agree to return the Cup or Trophy to the Competition Secretary on or before **1st March**. If the Cup or trophy is lost or damaged whilst under our care we agree to refund to the Competition the amount of its current value or the cost of its thorough repair.’

Failure to comply with this request will incur a fine of £50.00.’

Protests Heard

Blue Marlin

Fine 1646 regarding rule 9E

It was decided that the competition can not be held responsible for the lack of any playing kit that makes the team infringe this rule. The reasons given by Blue Marlin are therefore not acceptable to this competition and the committee decided that the fee be kept and that the original fine should stand.

Fine 1352 regarding league fee’s

An extension was granted to the club to pay these, the deadline for payment was not met therefore the committee decided that the original fine should stand

Appeal upheld

Fine 1879 regarding late match card

The protest was denied by the committee but they deemed it sufficient warning to have notified the club regarding this instance and taking into account the clubs record to date decided to rescind the fine.

Protest fee forfeited.

FC Tilburg Regents

Fine 1871 regarding late result

The protest was heard using the clubs letter as their mitigating circumstances. The committee would like to point out that even though the game kicked off ‘nearer to 3’ as this is a league recognised kick off time anyway you would still have been able to phone the result in on time. Protest denied original fine stands, fee forfeited.

St Johns Athletic

Fine 1862 regarding rule 9E

The protest was heard using the clubs letter as to the mitigating circumstances in this matter. The committee would like to point out to the complainant that, as he states, ‘he asks the ref if the ref wants him to change shirts to match the team sheet’. If this is the case then by his own admission St Johns could have been wearing the correct shirt numbers without the need to consult the referee.

Protest denied, fee forfeited, original fine to stand.

All above decisions are liable to appeal under rule 16
